Event Title: Gandhi Jayanthi Celebration with Saplings of Plants

Date: 2nd October 2022

Location: Raffles University, Neemrana, Rajasthan

NSS Report for Raffles University - Blood Donation Camp (14/02/2022)

Event Title: Blood Donation Camp

Date: 14th February 2022

Venue: Raffles University Campus, Neemrana, Rajasthan

Overview: The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit at Raffles University organized a Blood Donation Camp on 14th February 2022. This camp was conducted in collaboration with the local district hospital's blood bank, and it marked an important contribution towards fulfilling the blood supply needs of nearby medical facilities. The event underscored the importance of voluntary blood donation, which saves countless lives every year, and it encouraged students to take an active role in such humanitarian causes.

Campaign Goals:

Many participants expressed a willingness to donate again in the future, signaling a positive shift in attitudes towards blood donation.

NSS Report for Raffles University - Plantation Day (14/09/2022)

Event Title: Plantation Day

Date: 14th September 2022

Venue: Raffles University Campus, Neemrana, Rajasthan

Event Overview: On 14th September 2022, the NSS unit of Raffles University organized a grand Plantation Day as part of its ongoing commitment to environmental sustainability. The event was a significant step towards creating a greener campus and raising awareness about the importance of tree plantation in combating climate change. Students, faculty members, and staff enthusiastically participated in planting a diverse range of saplings across the university grounds, contributing to the creation of an eco-friendlier environment.

Objectives:

- To increase the green cover on the university campus.
- To promote environmental awareness and responsibility among students and staff.
- To contribute to global efforts to fight climate change through local action.
- To instill a sense of ownership and responsibility towards nature in the university community.

Event Details:

Event Title: International Yoga Day Celebration

Date: 22nd June 2022
